Literacy Activity Compound Word Practice

Snowman is a compound word that is made-up of the words "snow" and "man." This activity will allow children to make their own snow words.

- 1. Print out the picture of snow. <u>Click on the image to open a PDF.</u>
- 2. Have your child find objects around the house that they would like to use to make snow words.
- 3. Have them lay the object next to the picture and practice combining the words.


Example: Box – if laid next to the picture of snow, both words would create the word snowbox.



Math Activity Snowman Button Math

What you will need:

- dice
- 10 buttons
- Have your child roll the dice and count the number of dots on them.
